Seed Library




A seed library collects and stores seeds and shares them with members of the community for free. Seeds may be from regional seed companies, donated from gardeners who have grown locally adapted varieties of edibles, or wildflowers that serve as nectar and host plants for pollinators. Seed libraries encourage biodiversity and decrease our reliance on major seed companies. This helps combat seed monocultures which threaten the world's food supply.

Why are seed libraries important?

- I. Four giant companies control more than 60% of the world's seed supply>industrial monocultures = decreased biodiversity.
- 2. Saving and sharing seeds, particularly locally adapted varieties, helps us build a more secure food supply.
- 3. Providing seeds for free also encourages our community to learn and practice gardening and the art of growing your own food.

Our Seed Library is a place you can come to "borrow" any seeds you can use. There are annual and perennial flowers, vegetables, and herbs. If you have extra seeds at home or can harvest some of your seeds at the end of the season, you are welcome to bring them in and add them to our seed library for others to use!
